

SAT COLLEGE PREPARATION COURSE COMMITMENT

<u>Both</u> parents and students must commit to students' attendance, course responsibilities, and behavior requirements outlined below. The Child and Elder Care Plan pays Kaplan, the course provider, between \$200-\$400 for each student that attends the class. The expenditure of these benefit dollars must conform to the purpose of the Plan: to assist Local 2 members with their family responsibilities, in this case preparing students for college.

<u>Parents will be called if students are late or absent without permission</u>. If students are absent frequently, do not complete homework assignments, or are inattentive in class, the purpose of attending the course – to do well on the official SAT test – will not be achieved.

At the end of the course, parents will receive a report that includes their student's test scores and class attendance.

Class Behavior

- Cell phones off.
- All other electronic devices off.

- Sit up, pay attention.
- Participate in class discussion.

Course Homework

- All homework assignments must be completed on time.
- Students should expect to spend approximately 4 hours a week on assignments.

Class Attendance

- Students are expected to attend every class and test date.
- If students miss a class, and are excused, they must make up the class by going to Kaplan's website.
- Students can arrange with Kaplan instructors to take Saturday tests at home with their parents' permission.
- To get an absence excused, students must bring a note signed by a parent regarding the specific absence.
- Two unexcused absences are grounds for permanent dismissal from the course.
